 - Remove the proposed hollies from the buffer planting plan. Wax Myrtles planted at eight feet on center will be sufficient.

V. New Business:

A. Whale Branch Middle School Sports Field Lighting: Robert Merchant gave the project background. Barry Jones with Musco Lighting gave the presentation. Darrell Snyder motioned to approve the proposed lighting plans as presented with

the 50 footcandle average for the soccer field. Dorie Eckard seconded. Motion carried.

- **B. Beaufort Fun Park:** Eliza Hill and Wayne "Cooter" Ramsey recused themselves. Robert Merchant gave the project background. Scott Rabon, Eliza Hill and Cooter Ramsey gave the presentation. The Board took no action but gave the following comments:
 - The applicant should explore ways to reduce the total number of parking spaces on the site in order to provide more flexibility in arranging the site plan.
 - The applicant should pay close attention to the issue of stormwater detention devices to insure that proposed facilities are consistent with the County's pending Stormwater Utility Ordinance.
